# Changings Pastors, Why is it Different this Time?

Folks have asked why the process of filling a pastoral vacancy is so different this time. **Two reasons:** First, 35 pastors are retiring this year and only 5 new pastors are beginning ministry. So it is more urgent for congregations with no pastor to receive an appointment rather than a church with one pastor to receive the second. Also, we are in a visioning process this year and since it isn't clear yet exactly where God is leading, an interim pastor seems to be our best option. Then next year we can request leadership with the skills we will need to take Salem where God is calling us. Though transition is tough, we will work and endure together until we get to where God would have us be!


