In Sub-Saharan Africa, malaria kills a child every 2 minutes. But by using bed nets, providing access to diagnostic tests and medicine, draining standing water, and improving sanitation, malaria deaths have been reduced by more than half. "Imagine No Malaria' combines integrated health infrastructure, education and advocacy to address death and the debilitating effects of malaria in Sub-Saharan Africa.

Check It Out! Summer 2017 Salem Mission & Work Camp Opportunities

Northeast, July 24-28

Team up with Servants (a York County ministry that provides home maintenance and repair services to homeowners) and other volunteers to serve neighbors in need in Northeastern School District. Work may include: drywall, painting, roofing, flooring, yard work and other minor construction/maintenance tasks. The day begins at 7:00 AM with fellowship, breakfast, and packing lunches. Groups work from 8:00 AM - 4:00 PM, then come together for debriefing, devotions, and dinner at 5:00 PM. Participants then return home to enjoy their own hot shower and sleep in their own bed! Ages 14 and older are permitted. Fee is \$75 which helps to cover food, drink, and material costs. Volunteers may serve all 5 days or 1 or 2 depending on availability. Haiti, August 5-12

Step out in faith and take a trip to Haiti in August 2017! A group from Salem will travel with Global Partners in Peace and Development (check out gpartners.org) to Port au Prince, Haiti.. There is no age restriction, and many different ministry opportunities are available, to include children's ministries/VBS, construction, medical, special needs/orphan care, and street evangelism. Total cost for the trip is \$1700, which includes essentially everything you need while travelling (food, lodging, ministry costs, airfare, ground travel, etc.). You will also need a passport and possibly some additional immunizations/medications. Come and enjoy an evening with good food and fun.


