Report from the Seventh Session of the Susquehanna Conference of the United Methodist Church

June 9 – 11, 2016 - Messiah College

"Alive in Christ Together: Creating New Places for New People"

According to Rev. Dr. Thomas L. Salsgiver, the Dean of the Conference Cabinet, "Being alive in Christ together means that we must share our joy and our "aliveness" with those who don't know what it means to be alive in Christ. It may mean we begin new activities in our church or new ministries to the community. We need to be celebrating our unity, minimizing our differences, and making places for new people." At Conference, we United Methodists strove to put the spirit of these words into action.

Bishop Jeremiah J. Park presided over Annual Conference with great conviction and fervor, providing us with a model we could strive to follow in our worshipping.

The Laity Session was led by our conference Lay Leader, John Konieszny. He charged the laity to promise we would never say, "I'm just a lay-person", when God calls. We are all in this together. "We are better together!"

During the work sessions, many reports, recommendations, and resolutions were heard and approved. We discussed and voted on the Funding Plan for Ministry. The importance of our Shares of Ministry was highlighted. More information will be shared with each church showing that the Shares do more than we think. FCSUMC has a 100% giving rate! The church's Youth held a number of fund raising activities which helped raise close to their goal of \$7500 for the Youth Service Fund.

The resolution on human sexuality was withdrawn by General Conference. Bishop Park reported that a special group is being assembled to meet and create a more Christ-Like model. In a spirit of openness, he asks for all to be in deep prayer to stay in unity on this matter. There is a strong desire for unity without denying their convictions in their heart. Please pray on this issue.

Missions were a major focus for the Conference. Various mission's work were highlighted through presentations and displays. The following continue to have a profound impact. The Bishop's Partners in Mission pull together two missions that need continued assistance: "Imagine No More Debt" for Mission Central, and "Imagine No Malaria" for Mosquito Nets. First, Mission Central continues to connect God's Resources with human need through disaster response, mission outreach, and mission education. Mission Central still has \$800,000 left on its mortgage. At conference, The Bishop's Partners in Mission Giving presented a check to Mission Central for over \$71,000. Secondly, Imagine No Malaria is an initiative to reduce, maybe someday eliminate, malaria around the world. At conference, The Bishop's Partners in Mission Giving presented a check for over \$64,000 to purchase more nets that are impregnated with insecticide in order to keep away the mosquitoes that carry the disease. Opportunities to support this mission work will be presented to our congregation.

Our worship services provided inspirational sermons, and allowed us to hear and participate in uplifting music. We remembered those pastoral families who entered the Kingdom of Heaven at the Memorial Service; rejoiced with those who entered retirement at the Celebration of Ministry Service; and prayed for new paths of ministry for those who were ordained or commissioned at the Service of Ordination.

SALEM'S ONLINE DIRECTORY

Have you been trying to contact a member but the contact information listed in the directory is no longer valid OR he/she is a newer member and are not included in the directory? With our new ONLINE Directory, member information will be up to date all the time! It is easy to access and easy to activate your information for others to view!

How to sign in:

- Log into our membership site at www.onrealm.org/fishingcreekumc
- Scroll down to the bottom of the Sign in Screen and click **Register Now**.
- ♦ Complete the registration screen by using the email address that is on file in the church office (it is important that you use the email that is on file in the office, otherwise a duplicate profile will be set up.) If you are unsure of the email on file, please contact the office before signing in. An email address is *required* to register. Each person in the family must have a separate email address in order to log in and/or to be visible by others. If you do not have an email address, contact the Church Office.
- Assign yourself a password as directed.
- You will be directed to check your email for further instructions to complete the registration process.
- Follow the instructions and you will be brought automatically into your Profile screen showing your personal information. Your account is activated.
- To select the contact information that you want to be visible to other members, move your curser to the upper right of the Contact Information line. Click on the pencil icon.
- If there are changes to your contact information, you may update your profile at this time.
- Beside the Address and Phone section you will see an icon that looks like a pad lock. Click on the lock. Currently your privacy should be set on "Group Leaders & Church Staff". If you would like others to be able to see that field information, click on "Everyone in the Church". Do this for both fields (Address & Phones). Do the same for the Email address field.
- Be sure to scroll to the bottom and click "Save" when you are finished making all updates.
- You can find other members who have activated their profiles by typing their name in the "Search" field at the top of the page.
- ♦ When you are finished in the database, click on your name in the upper right corner of the screen. Then click "Sign Out".


