Neighborhood Fun Night 2017

Neighborhood Fun Night is going on the road. For the past 10 years we have had Neighborhood Fun Night at the church. This year we are taking it on the road to National Night Out at Roof Park on Tuesday, August 1. National Night Out is a national outreach to the community offered by local police. This is the fourth year for National Night Out in Fairview Township. They had over 2000 attendees last year.

This will move our church closer to one of our specific goals, (blurring the lines between community and church). We are going out among the community. We are already doing this through, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, CDA, Family Promise, use of our facilities for Lacrosse, among a host of other things. This is another step in that direction.

I attended their initial meeting for this year on May 4, 2017. I am very excited to be a part of National Night Out this year, and they are excited to have us. We will be providing 700 Hamburgers, 700 hotdogs, and 180 lbs of Potatoes and the volunteers to cook and serve the food. We will have two booths which we can do whatever we want. We are in the planning stages of that right now.

In Luke 10 Jesus sent out the disciples into the surrounding communities to tell of his Love for them. We will be doing the same in our own community on August 1. As you well know, there are 7800 people within a two mile radius of our church who have no church connection. We will be able to connect with a portion of them on August 1.

I have been so blessed by your participation in Neighborhood Fun Night these last ten years. Please be in prayer for us as we take in on the road to show our community how much Jesus Loves them and how much we love them.

Joey and Anita's family lived in a small place together with their four children and grandchild when the worst happened...an old air conditioning unit started to spark, and everything the family had soon went up in flames. They were living in a hotel, but money was running out quickly... such a big family with teenage-children...they had nowhere to go...



Lee had worked the majority of her life. Because of some health difficulties, she moved in with family. She soon adopted her newborn great niece, Ashley, when Ashley's mother gave her up. The two lived with Lee's family until a year ago



when two of her relatives passed away. Between that and her medical bills that kept piling up, Lee and Ashley found themselves with nowhere to turn and no house to call a home.

Both of these families found Family Promise and you, the members of Fishing Creek Salem UMC, who opened your hearts and the doors of your church home to host children and parents who are experiencing homelessness.

When you look at the faces of these families, they are not what you generally expect to see when talking about homelessness. Yet, parents with children make up 40% of the homeless population in our country.

The Family Promise families are coming to Salem church June 4-11, and they need you. The families stay each evening and overnight during that week. This is your chance to do meaningful mission work right in your own church building:

- Be the evening host and bring your children with you...what a great way to teach your little ones that while our circumstances may be different, underneath we're all the same.
- Be the overnight host and bring a friend...you'll get to spend some time together in a way that's impacting lives beyond your own.
- Drive the FP van you're home in time to get ready for work in the morning, and home in time for dinner in the evening.
- ~ Help with set-up or tear-down and create a welcoming environment for our guests without homes.
- ~ Make a meal to share with the families.

Because people like you step forward to help, children experiencing homelessness are safe while their parents work to rebuild their lives. Today, Joey and Anita are both working and live in an apartment in the Camp Hill area. Lee and Ashley are living in Carlisle and continue to send their love and praise back to FP volunteers. The Measure of a Man: Twenty Attributes of a Godly Man by Gene Getz

This book has taught hundreds of thousands of men around the world how to live according to God's direction faithfully, lovingly, and spiritually. True masculinity is not measured by the strength of a man, but by these 20 Biblical guidelines. With life applications and words of inspiration, here is Gene's greatest work, fully rewritten and updated to reach the new generation of modern men.

Big Rus and Me, Father and Son: Lessons of Life by Tim Russert

This book, written in Russert's easygoing, straight-talking style, offers an irresistible collection of personal memories. Russert recalls the dedicated teachers who stimulated his imagination and intellect, sparking a lifelong passion for politics and journalism, and inspired a career that took him from editor of his elementary school newspaper to moderator of Meet the Press. Being God's Man by Finding Contentment: Real Life, Powerful Truth for God's Men by Stephen Arterburn
