The traditional **advent season** runs the four Sundays before Christmas. This year, in order to spend more time with the story of Christmas, we are "adding a little to" this special season.

Starting November 13, we engage in a 6-week series of sermons and study called **The Christmas Experience**. Our hope is that diving more deeply into the characters and the narrative of Jesus' birth will remind us that Christmas is much more than a holiday. It was a holy event!

We kick off our "stretched out advent" with a church-wide **MOVIE NIGHT** on the evening of the 13th. Bring friends and family to the Fellowship Hall for co-coa, popcorn, and a viewing of feature-length film *The Christmas Experience*.

Our **Sunday morning sermons** will explore scripture and give insights to the people who actually lived out The Christmas Experience years ago. We will see that God chose each individual in the Christmas story for a specific purpose.

WE will also have **WEDNESDAY EVENING TABLE TALKS** – a chance for anyone who wants to gather with others and explore the meaning of this

amazing story – on Wednesdays, 6:30 – 8:00 in the fellowship hall. If you can't attend mid-week, we will also offer Sunday morning sessions with the Sunday School classes at 9:30 and 11:00.

Although our Advent is a little longer this year, we are providing numerous opportunities to prepare your heart for Christ's arrival. What happened then changes everything now. Let's join together to grow closer to Jesus as we embark on *The Christmas Experience*.

It is important that we ensure the safety of our children as well as the well-being of the church, so that they may continue to fulfill the purpose of Christ's church here on Earth.


If you are, or would like to be, a Certified Volunteer at Fishing Creek Salem United Methodist Church you must take a Safe Sanctuaries training and certification assessment at least every three (3) years and produce FBI, PA Child Abuse History, and PA Criminal Background Check clearances every sixty (60) months. For more information on how to complete the clearances and take a Safe Sanctuaries training, see the Safe Sanctuaries bulletin board outside of the church office or contact Nicole Wolf at nicolemarie405@comcast.net.

A Safe Sanctuaries training will be offered by the Susquehanna Conference at Salem in Room 115 on Saturday, November 19th from 9:00-11:30 AM. For other dates, please see the Safe Sanctuaries bulletin board outside of the church office. Assistance with taking the online Safe Sanctuaries training, as well as completing clearances, will be available Sunday, November 20thfrom 9:30-11:00 AM in Room 215 at Salem. Following these IRS regulations, donations received and/or postmarked after 12/31/16 must be counted as donations in 2017 (no matter what date may be associated with the gift).

SALEM'S COMMUNITY GARDEN REPORT



It has been a great growing season for the FCSUMC Community Giving Garden! There were 8 households who planted, maintained and harvested from the garden. In these households, there were 15 adults and 12 youth/children; six families who attend FCSUMC and two from the community.

We did not keep records on quantity, but the variety growing was obvious-tomatoes, beans, annual flowers, pumpkins, squash, peppers, corn, watermelon and more. Some of the members were even able to donate extra produce to the Plant-An-Extra-Row ministry!

The gardeners planted without worry of deer and other garden pests thanks to the fence that was installed by Tyson Fence Company and funded by a donation from the Salem Players. The gardens soil was good for growing thanks to years of preparation by Boy Scout Troop 198. Thanks to all who gave this new ministry such a great start!

The season is coming to an end now. We will be cleaning up the garden and preparing the area for the winter. But even as we do this work, we will be thinking about the warmer days to come and assigning plots. If you are interested, each person will be offered a plot (180 square feet or larger) at no charge for growing annual crops for their family. 

This month's newsletter is devoted to new books for our youth (ages 12-18). It's so important that we encourage our youth to read literature that shows them Christian role models and heroes. The following new additions to our library will do just that:

Christianity by Philip Wilkinson

This Eyewitness book explains the history and teachings of one of the world's great religions and the many ways that Christians celebrate their faith.

Jesus Freaks and Jesus Freaks II by DC Talk

Rarely have books captured the attention of Christians of all ages as *Jesus Freaks* have with their stories of Christian martyrs. They feature testimonies of revolutionaries who took a stand for Christ against the culture of their day, along with new stories of martyrs through the centuries. DC Talk challenges readers to pray for the persecuted church around the world and openly stand for Jesus.

The Narrow Road by Brother Andrew

This bestseller tells of the young Dutch factory worker's incredible efforts to transport Bibles across closed borders and the miraculous ways in which God provided for him every step of the way. The book also features information about ministry to the persecuted church today, including country profiles, quotes, and Christians in underground churches.

The One Year Josh McDowell's Youth Devotions by Bob Hostetter

Aimed directly at the needs and interests of preteens and teens, this devotion book is a Right from Wrong devotional that helps young people apply the Scriptures in daily decision making. Covering a host of topics that are relevant to today's teens, this devotional encourages teens to think through difficult choices, enabling them to discover why certain choices are right or wrong.

True: Real Stories About God Showing Up in the Lives of Teens by Irene Dunlap

This is a collection of real-life stories of God's presence in personal situations, both the ordinary and the more challenging, that help reveal the true nature of God in the universe and His work in people's lives.

I Am Malala by Malala Yousafzai

Raised in a once-peaceful area of Pakistan transformed by terrorism, Malala was taught to stand up for what she believes, so she fought for her right to be educated. And on October 9, 2012, she nearly lost her life for the cause. She was shot point-blank while riding the bus on her way home from school. No one expected her to **SURVIVE**. Now Malala is an international symbol of peaceful protest and the youngest ever Nobel Peace Prize winner.

The Back to the Bible Sunday School Class News

Beginning November 6 and continuing after Christmas, our class will be learning from *Joseph: The Journey to Forgiveness* by Melissa Spoelstra. This 6-week study explores what God has to say to us about grace and forgiveness through Joseph's story of trial and triumph found in Genesis 37-50. As we study his dreams, betrayers, dysfunctional family, struggle to forgive, and journey toward common questions such as "How do I stop dwelling on the hurt?" and "Is forgiving someone excusing what happened?" Whether or not you're working through a hurtful situation right now, you can learn from Joseph how to release your past and present hurts to God and allow Him to do a supernatural work of forgiveness in your life. Student books and a video are included.

Beginning November 13 and continuing through Advent, we will be studying *The Christmas Experience* by Kyle Idleman, along with the rest of our church. Kyle is the Teaching Minister at Southeast Christian Church in Louisville, KY with over 21,000 in attendance. He examines the Christmas story in detail, emphasizing how God chose each individual in the Christmas story for a specific purpose. We'll see as Joseph leads his family with selfless faithfulness, as Mary follows obediently God's plan for her life, and as shepherds struggle with doubt as they wonder... could this really be their Savior?

We would love for you to join us for one or both of these studies. We meet Sunday mornings from 9:30-10:30 in room 210. Why don't you give us a try?
