Henry David Thoreau, in his classic book, Walden, told of a powerful custom of the Mucclasse Indians. Once each year, they had a village clean up called a "busk." First, they would make new clothes, furniture, and cooking utensils. They would keep all of these new things in a building outside of the village. When everything was ready, they would begin their annual spring cleaning.

Every corner of every house was scrubbed. Every stick of furniture was thrown out. Every child's toy went to the garbage heap. The dirt paths were swept, and the weeds were plucked up. Even the food left over from winter was thrown out. All of the refuse in the village was gathered together into a pile in the center of the village. Then the chief set it on fire. As they watched it burn, they took off their clothes and tossed them into the fire. They


tended the fire carefully and made sure that everything was gone.

Council Update

Salem's Council has been busy. We started the year with an indepth review of our structure, roles, and guidelines. Pastor Les led us in a book study of Kay Kotan's Mission Possible, a resource which outlines best practices for the simplified structure within the United Methodist Church. We found, in many instances, that Salem's Council structure is right on the mark. However, there was one area we determined needs some work. We've decided to add a Nominations and Leader Development Committee in order to be in complete agreement with best practices and the *UMC Book of Discipline*. The Council will be working on this more throughout the year and plan to have the new committee in effect in 2022. More details will be shared as they are available.

In other efforts, the Pastor Parish Relations team has developed a new evaluation form for Lead Pastor reviews; the Trustees have been working with those who care for our cemetery on pricing of plots, and the Finance team has been reviewing special account definitions and restrictions as well as overseeing the budget. In our April meeting, we approved updated policies.

Wishing Stacey Wilkinson Well in Her New Position!

Stacey Wilkinson, who has served for over two years in the position of Office Assistant, has taken another position in a different field. She has been an invaluable asset with managing COVID restrictions, helping Pastor Les get acclimated and, of course, managing her "regular" job.

We are excited for her as she moves into a new adventure, but she will be very missed by all of us! You will still have the pleasure of her family worshipping at Salem.

Her duties will be divided between Tracey Michelsen and Sandy Herman. Tracey will now be the designer and contact for the Sunday Announcements and the monthly newsletter. Sandy will be producing the bulletins each



Gun Moon by Jeffrey L. Staley

In 1898, 3-year-old Chinese-American girl Mei Chun Lai is sold to a cruel brothel keeper, where a sympathetic prostitute befriends her. Two years later, at the height of a plague quarantine, a young Methodist woman rescues Chun and places her in a home for abused and trafficked girls. The home is destroyed in the 1906 earthquake and fire. Chun and a group of seven other Chinese children embark on a cross-country singing tour to raise funds to rebuild. When their home matron suffers a breakdown, 13-year-old Chun must lead the band of children home. Based on a true story.




The Bird Boys: A Delpha Wade and Tom Phelan Mystery by Lisa Sandlin

After careful consideration of time resources and how Salem is reaching out to the community through other ministries, the Christmas Closet Volunteers have decided to discontinue this ministry. Christmas Closet was an important part of Salem's community outreach. We have expanded our community outreach, since its beginnings, with Budget Inn Community Center, an expansion of Soul Food Ministry, and monthly food distribution. We will no longer collect items for CC in the Ministry Workshop. Many organizations such as Community Aid and Salvation Army can use the items that we typically collected. Serve @ Salem – Counting on you

At any hour or any day, a casual believer searches the internet for a new church. What makes a church more attractive than all the rest? Studies have shown that opportunities to do **hands-on service to others** peaks their interest. Congregations involved in their local community glimmers off an internet home page like a precious jewel for those seeking a faith community in which to belong.

Salem is a shining gem in this community ... and what we DO is something folks would like to know more fully. Pastor Jenny has a measurable ministry goal. She is literally "counting on you." She is starting "the year 2021 count" of the number of persons from Salem who are involved with hands-on ministry in our community – one serving op or event, your name counted. No one will be counted twice who has served. The goal is to get as many Salemites as possible doing hands-on ministry. By the end of 2021, we will have a total number of the people who have served in hands-on ministry at Salem. Hands-on ministry qualifies as working directly, face to face, with people we do not know. Here are a few examples:

- Distributing food boxes or community take-out meals
- Student Summer "Grab n Go" lunches at the Budget Inn
- Coffee, Donuts and Talk, Sunday afternoons at BICC
- Vacation Bible School (exceeding 100+ children)
- National Night Out (pending)
- Soul Food Pantry

By January 2022, and Pastor Jenny's careful account of volunteers, Salem will be able to share (on our website) "the hands-on serving percentage" by the number of people doing hands on ministry at Salem based on one year of serving. You think we can reach 40 % of Salem serving in hands-on ministry based on our average attendance of 275? So, prayerfully consider a way you can serve at least **once** before January.

We honor Jesus by this goal, and also say in a specific measurable way that we Serve @ Salem in the example of Christ, who came to serve not to be served.
