Serving Ministry Update

Salem has distributed free emergency food boxes monthly since last October. Recently, area food banks informed us that free food boxes would no longer be available.

The volunteer Pop-up Team confirms the need to continue serving 30-40 families each month. This local need is clarified in statistical studies done in 2019 by area food banks and non-profits organizations.

Prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, the 17319 zip code revealed:

High food scarcity

(% of hungry persons exceeds the % food available)

Low food distribution

(limit in places to receive food)

Food needs being met is less than 25%

With hearts at Salem ready to serve, the York County Food Bank and the Central PA Food Bank see our zest to help, and support



our church in future steps to share food as a partnering agency.

As a food bank partner, Salem would be considered a food pantry which would open the pipeline of free food resources (USDA – DEPT Ag) as well as several other nutritious options (some offered at a minimal fee from .03 - .018 per lb). Pastor Jenny is in communication with leaders of Salem who support further extending our arm of Christian service into the community. Soul Food Ministry will continue to share food and work as always to make sure no one in our neighborhood is hungry. Egg-makers, who utilize the church kitchen and storage, are ready to share space for new steps in food sharing.
