Changings Pastors, Why is it Different this Time?

Folks have asked why the process of filling a pastoral vacancy is so different this time. **Two reasons:**



First, 35 pastors are retiring this year and only 5 new pastors are beginning ministry. So it is more

urgent for congregations with no pastor to receive an appointment rather than a church with one pastor to receive the second.

Also, we are in a visioning process this year and since it isn't clear yet exactly where God is leading, an interim pastor seems to be our best option. Then next year we can request leadership with the skills we will need to take Salem where God is calling us.

Though transition is tough, we will work and endure together until we get to where God would have us be!

I remember thinking about this irony many times as I raised my sons. I read journals and books and tried to model myself after the best examples of parents that I had seen in my life. In retrospect, I made some mistakes, but my sons know that I did the best I could and I gave them all my love.

If you are interested in some Christian parenting books, please check out the library shelf 248.432. There are general parenting books and specialty books about challenging situations or just raising boys or girls. Below are some parenting books that have been added to our collection in the past year. Please check them out!



The Hidden Gifts of the Introverted Child: Helping Your Child Thrive in an Extroverted World by Marti Olsen Laney Psy. D. The author explains introversion as a hardwired temperament, not a disability, and tells just what parents need to do to help their child become the person he or she is meant to be and succeed in an extroverted world.

How Your Child Is Smart: A Life-Changing Approach to Learning by Dawna Markova This book identifies six patterns of learning and teaches parents how to help their children learn and communicate most effectively.





The Explosive Child: A New Approach for Understanding and Parenting Easily Frustrated, Chronically Inflexible Children by Ross W. Greene

This book lays out a sensitive, practical approach to helping your child at home and school, including: reducing hostility and antagonism between the child and adults, antici-

pating situations in which the child is most likely to explode, creating an environment in which explosions are less likely to occur, focusing less on reward and punishment and more on communication and collaborating problem solving, and helping your child develop the skills to be more flexible and handle frustration more adaptively.

Setting Limits with Your Strong-willed Child: Eliminating Conflict by Establishing Clear, Firm, and Respectful Boundaries by Robert J. MacKenzie

This book gives proven techniques and procedures that provide a refreshing alternative to the ineffective extremes of punishment and permissiveness.
