

Consecration Sunday Is Coming

Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage



of their incomes.

Our congregation's finance committee has selected the *New Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year. *New Consecration Sunday* is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like mem-

bers of a social

club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. *New Consecration Sunday* encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

We will celebrate Consecration Sunday at all services on November 4, 2018. During worship services on that day, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's mission of making disciples, who make disciples, who change the world.

- We reserve the right to edit prayer requests to ensure they are appropriate for public communication and protect the individual's privacy.


Library News By Kathy Alford

Have you ever read a *Chicken Soup for the Soul* book? This series, started by Jack Canfield and Mark Victor Hansen in 1993, is the best-selling paperback book series of all time with 250 published books. Canfield and Hansen started the books with the simple idea that people could help each other by sharing stories about their lives. They entitled their series "Chicken Soup" because they wanted the stories to soothe and provide comfort, just like their grand-mothers' cooking.

Jack and Mark recognized that Chicken Soup for the Soul had grown into something much bigger than the book series they had created. So, in 2008, William (Bill) Rouhana, Amy Newmark and Robert Jacobs bought Chicken Soup for the Soul from them. Today, Bill and Amy, a husband-and-wife team, along with everyone else at Chicken Soup for the Soul, are responding to readers' requests and expanding beyond the bookstore. They make wholesome and balanced pet foods because they know how special the relationship is between people and their pets. They're online now with forums, apps, and a Chicken Soup for the Soul YouTube channel. They're working hard on a new Chicken Soup for the Soul TV show and a major motion picture. Meanwhile, Amy, publisher and co-author of the Chicken Soup for the Soul books, and her team of editors are collecting stories from their readers and the public, just like they've done since the beginning. They have new books coming out almost every month. From their books, to their food for pets, to the new TV show, they're always looking for ways to share happiness, inspiration and hope through everything they do.

There are over 100 *Chicken Soup for the Soul* books found throughout our church library. Some books are based on age, such as preteen, kids, and teenager. Others are for various occupations: teachers, writers, and nurses, for example. How about different family members? For sports lovers there are

books on baseball, golf, fishing, etc. There are Chicken Soup books based on hobbies such as gardening, enjoying nature, and traveling. In other words, there is a Chicken Soup book for everyone! The stories are short & allow you to read them in short periods of time. Here are two of the books in our library:

BACK TO THE BIBLE SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASS By Kathy Alford

During October we will continue studying Lee Strobel's book *The Case for Christ* and watching the accompanying DVD. Lee Strobel, a seasoned journalist, chases down the biggest story in history--is there credible evidence that Jesus of Nazareth really is the Son of God? Tracing his own spiritual journey from atheism to faith, Strobel, former legal editor of the *Chicago Tribune*, cross-examines a dozen experts with doctorates from schools like Cambridge, Princeton, and Brandeis who are recognized authorities in their own fields. Strobel challenges them with questions like: How reliable is the New Testament? Does evidence for Jesus exist outside the Bible? Is there any reason to believe the resurrection was an actual event?

Our hopes for this study are that our faith will be made stronger and we will be able to witness with more evidence in addition to our strong faith. Lee Stroebel's story is another example of how God can dramatically change people's lives such as Saul of Tarsus and author C.S. Lewis.

- Overnight hosts (8:30pm 7:00am Sleep and help families get to the van in the morning.)
- Morning van driver (One or more days, Drive from FCSUMC to Day Center (Camp Hill) and then back. Approx. 6:30 –7:30 AM)
- Sunday morning clean-up crew (Nov 11 @ 7:30 AM 45 90 minutes)
- Laundry team (Pick up the sheets and blankets in FCSUMC office after 9:30 AM. Take them home to wash, bring then back and put away.)

Open Gym and Opportunity to Play on a Travel Basketball Team








NEW study... Seamless at the Summit
