TAX-FREE TRANSFERS TO CHARITY

Did you know that older IRA owners have a different way to give to charity? An IRA owner age 70 ½ or over, can directly transfer, tax-free, up to \$100,000 per year to an eligible charity. This option can be used for distributions from IRAs, regardless of whether the owners itemize their deductions.

To qualify, the funds must be transferred directly by the IRA trustee to the eligible charity. Distributed amounts may be excluded from the IRA owner's income—resulting in lower taxable income for the IRA owner. However, if the IRA owner excludes the distribution from income, no deduction, such as charitable contribution deduction may be taken for the distributed amount.

Amounts transferred to a charity from an IRA are counted in determining whether the owner has met the IRA's required minimum distribution (RMD). Consult your tax accountant to see if this option could be advantageous to you.

During January we will continue studying Lee Strobel's book *The Case for Christ.* Lee Strobel, a seasoned journalist, chases down the biggest story in history—is there credible evidence that Jesus of Nazareth really is the Son of God? Tracing his own spiritual journey from atheism to faith, Strobel, former legal editor of the *Chicago Tribune*, cross-examines a dozen experts with doctorates from schools like Cambridge, Princeton, and Brandeis who are recognized authorities in their own fields. Strobel challenges them with questions like: How reliable is the New Testament? Does evidence for Jesus exist outside the Bible?

New Year off to a fresh start and check us out.




WOMEN'S BOOK DISCUSSION





A word about the Twelve Days of Christmas – (December 25th through January 5th) It is more than just a song, or an obnoxious bonanza of gift giving. The Twelve Days represent a season of Christmas to be savored. At least a little longer than some traditionally do these days. May we remember the time of Christmas as an extended celebration. Instead of the Twelve Days of Christmas, may we consider:

The Twelve WAYS of Christmas

- 1st Way December 25th Remember Christ (light a candle for Jesus, read Luke 2:1-20)
- 2nd Way December 26th Prayer (pray to God for your family and for people in need)
- 3rd Way of December 27th Visit Others (knock on a neighbor's door, stop in on friends)
- 4th Way of December 28th Prepare for Visitors (be open to extend hospitality to someone new)
- 5th Way of December 29th Be Willing to Receive (allow others to give to you, receive gifts with grace)
- 6th Way of December 30th Be Watchful (ponder the future, pray for youth and children with broad futures)
- 7th Way of December 31st Be Joyous (commit to find joy each day; New Year's Eve, early or late, celebrate!)
- 8th Way of January 1st Make Room (declutter, a room, a drawer, a closet ... or a boggled mind)
- 9th Way of January 2nd Make Peace (be open to forgive, go and make peace, speak peace everywhere)
- 10th Way of January 3rd Tell Others ("how was your Christmas?" response in faith; best gift Jesus!)
- 11th Way of January 4th Give Thanks (no gift? Tell another how much you appreciate them)
- 12th Way of January 5th Give Gifts (giving other your best, not to out do others, but to honor God)
