

Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Beginning May 26 and continuing through June, we will be studying Adam Hamilton's *Simon Peter: Flawed but Faithful Disciple*. Hamilton takes an in-depth dive into the life, faith, and character of Simon Peter. Peter was not rich or educated, but was familiar with hard work. He was quick-tempered and impetuous, but possessed a passion that would change the world. He left everything to follow his teacher, yet struggled with doubt and fear.



Christian movies are hot right now! I am so glad to see that they are making a comeback. For years, the only ones available seemed to the first three movies of the *Left Behind* series which never continued to my disappointment. Now many of these blockbusters are appearing in movie theaters and are readily accessible through our television networks. Below are two new DVD additions to our church library. Come check them out!

God's Not Dead: A Light in the Darkness

This is the third movie of this series. We also have its predecessors in our library: *God's Not Dead* and *God's Not Dead 2*. This third movie of the set opens with a deadly fire ripping through St. James Church. Hadleigh University leaders use the tragedy to push the congregation off campus, forcing the church to defend its rights and bringing together estranged brothers for a reunion that opens old wounds and forces them to address the issues that pulled then apart.



Broken and Unbroken: Path to Redemption

This 2-movie collection contains both movies that are based on Laura Hillenbrand's book *Unbroken* (also in our library). The first movie follows the incredible life of Olympian and war hero Louis Zamperini who, along with two other crewmen, survived on a raft for 47 days after a near-fatal plane crash in WWII-only to be caught by the Japanese navy and sent to a prisoner-ofwar camp. This is the inspiring true story about the resilient power of the human spirit.

Beginning where *Unbroken* concludes, the next movie brings the rest of Louis Zamperini's inspirational true story to life. After surviving years of torture as a prisoner of war, Louis returns home from World War II, where he meets and marries Cynthia. Haunted by his past, he is driven deep into despair. But when Cynthia turns to God at the 1949 Billy Graham Crusade her most fervent prayer for Louis is to find peace and forgiveness.
